Morning: Royal Palace → Almudena Cathedral → Plaza Mayor

Midday: San Miguel Market → Puerta de Alcalá

Afternoon: Retiro Park → Temple of Debod → Gran Vía

Evening: Prado Museum or Reina Sofía → Night walk through the city center
